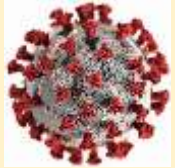


# Introduction

# Public Health

## ACHIEVEMENTS



### Key Actions achieved this week:

- Local Outbreak Management Plan written, shared with partners and then assured by Dept of Health and Social Care. It has been highly commended and being used nationally as an example of good practice. This is a significant piece of work achieved within very tight timelines.
- In collaboration with LifeBeat a number of different training sessions have been delivered for school staff regarding staff and student wellbeing and emotional literacy. Over 320 staff have engaged with the programme and feedback has been extremely positive.
- Development of leaflets for distribution in food boxes. One to focus on mental health and wellbeing and another to cover general health message.

- 851 tested at Taunton racecourse, 87 at mobile testing site at Yeovilton.

- 198 users of Healthy Somerset website this week

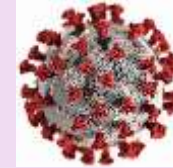

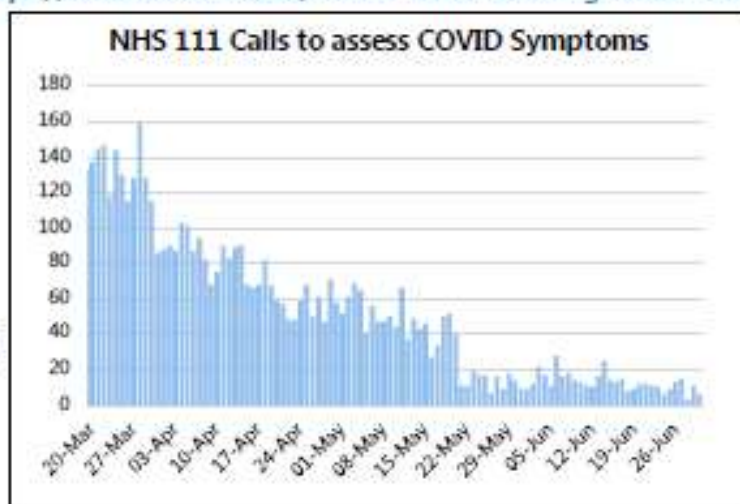

## NHS 111 COVID Demand



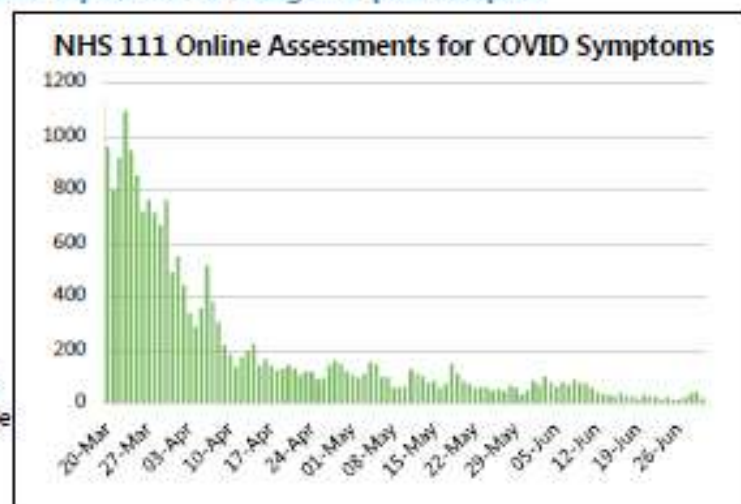
Latest daily Somerset based calls to NHS 111 to assess COVID symptoms

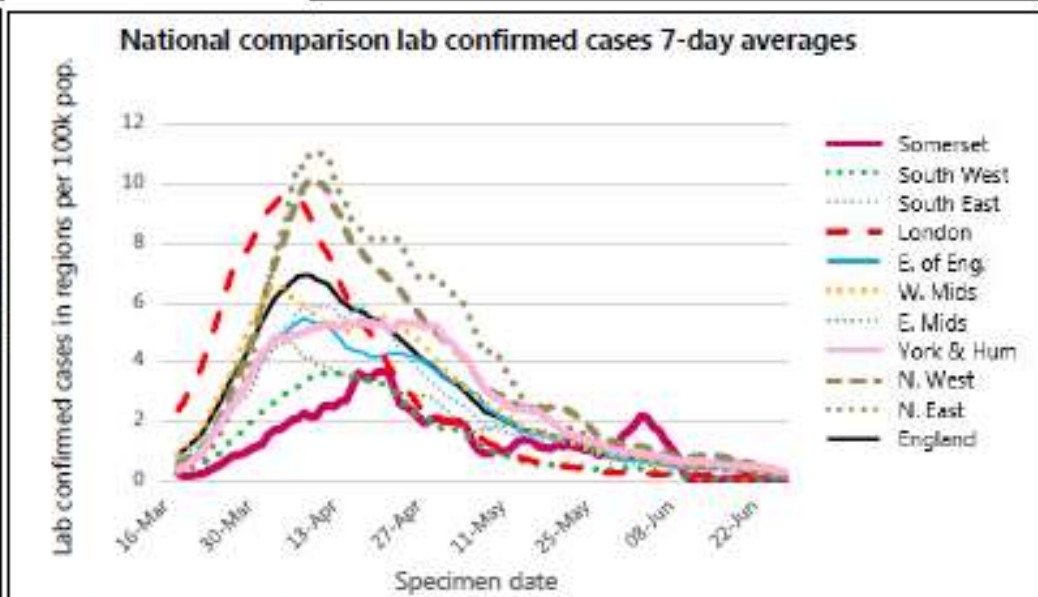
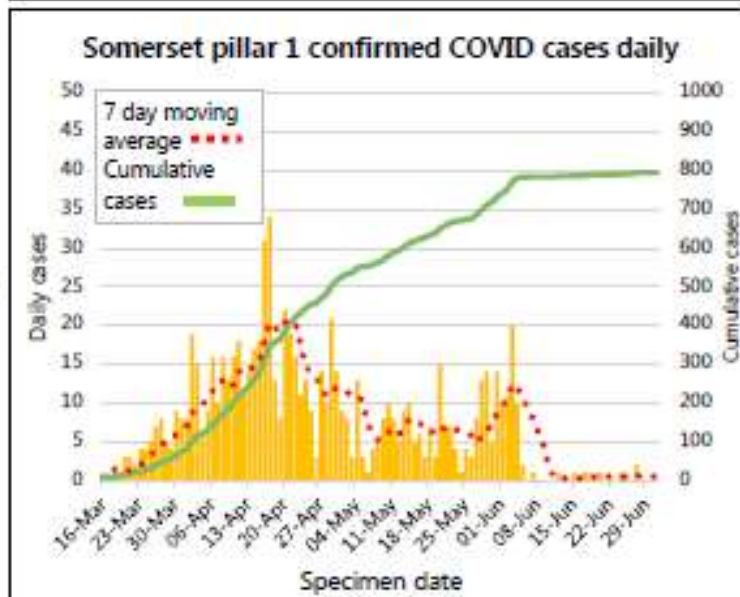


## Detected cases

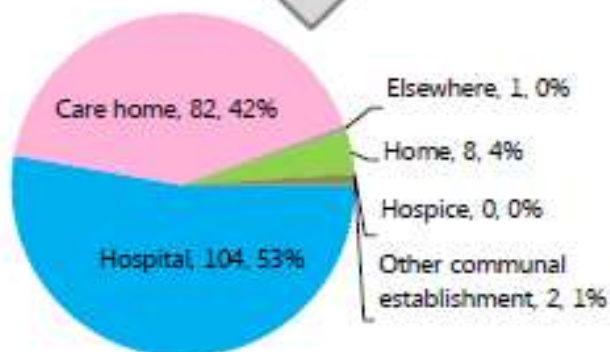

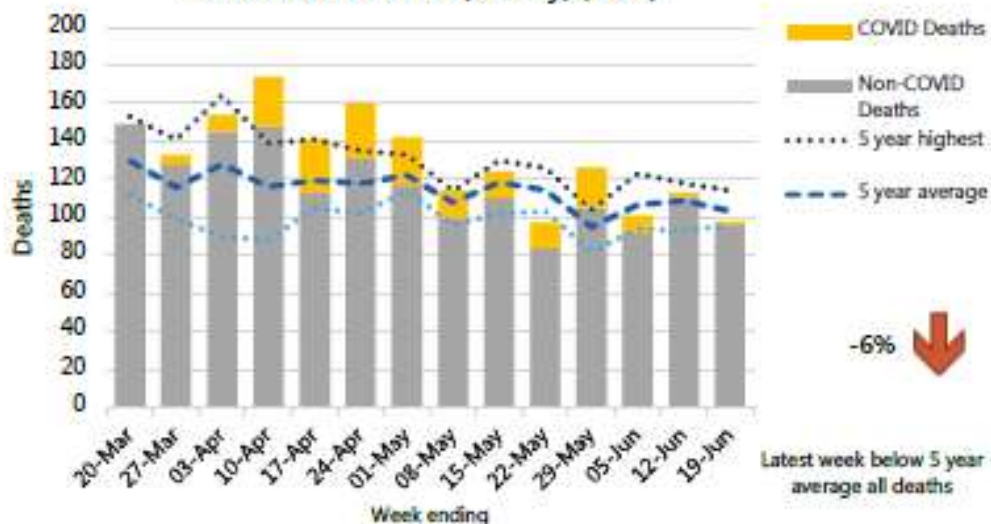

by Place of Death (ONS)

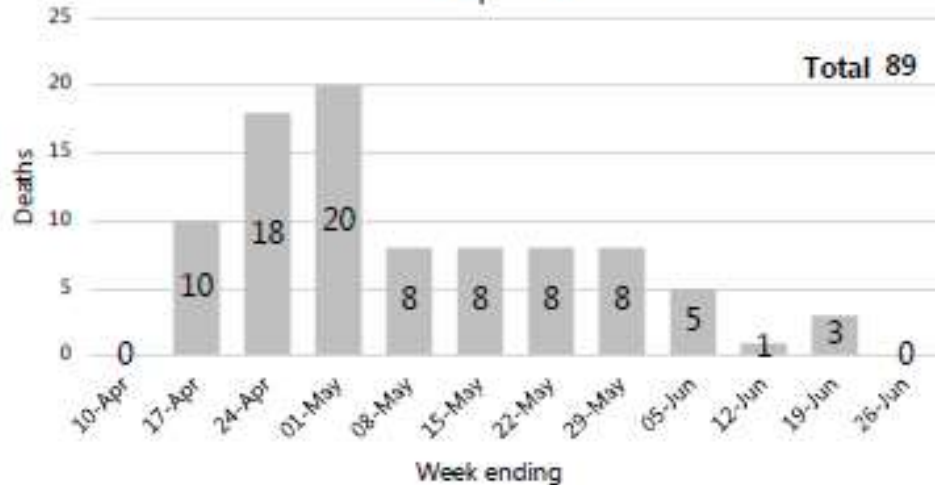

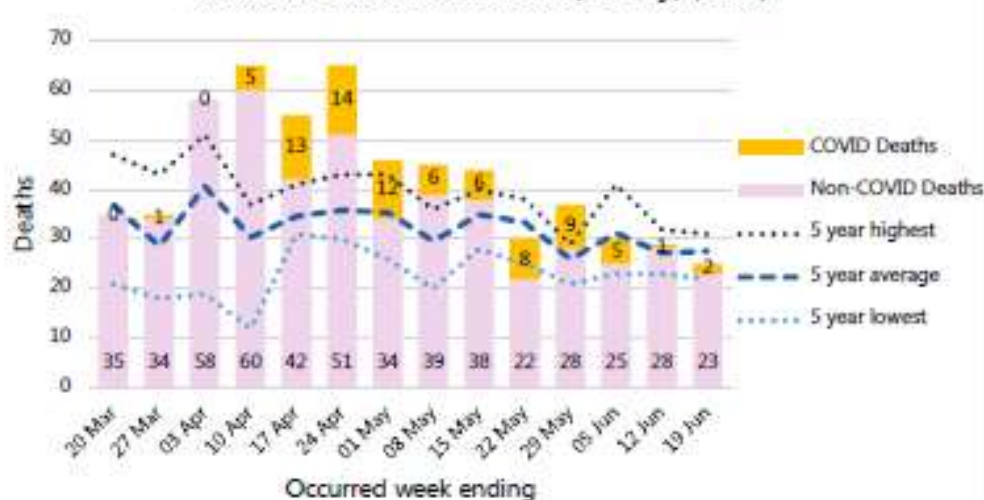
Somerset All Deaths (weekly) (ONS)



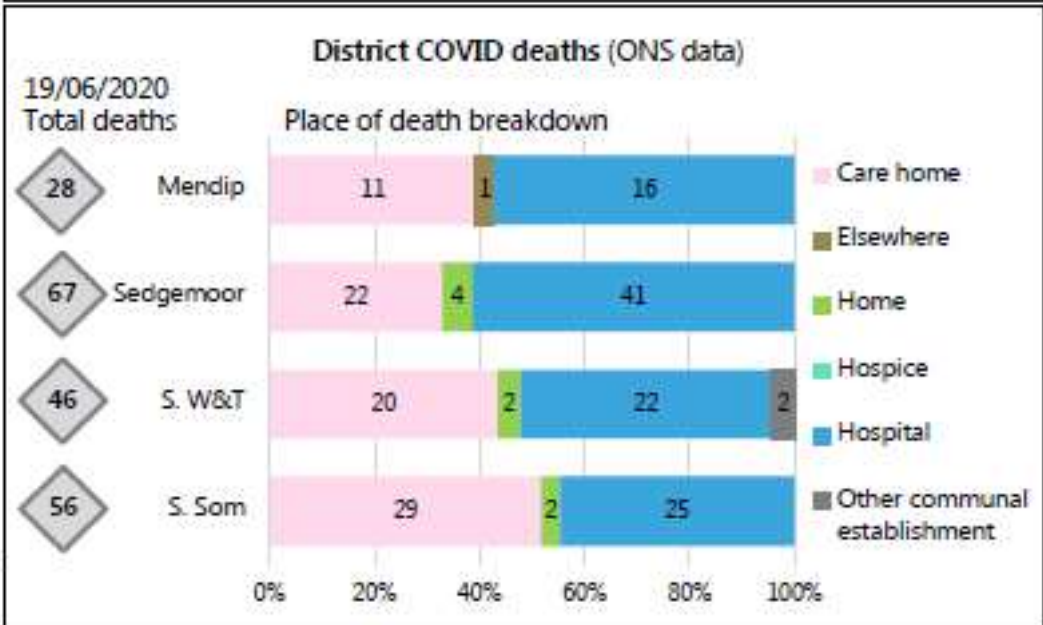
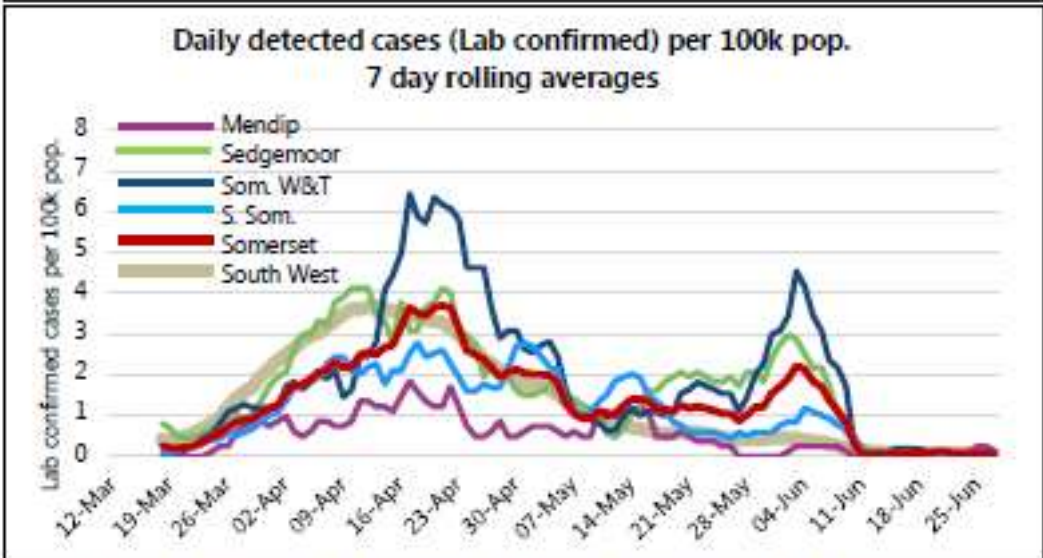
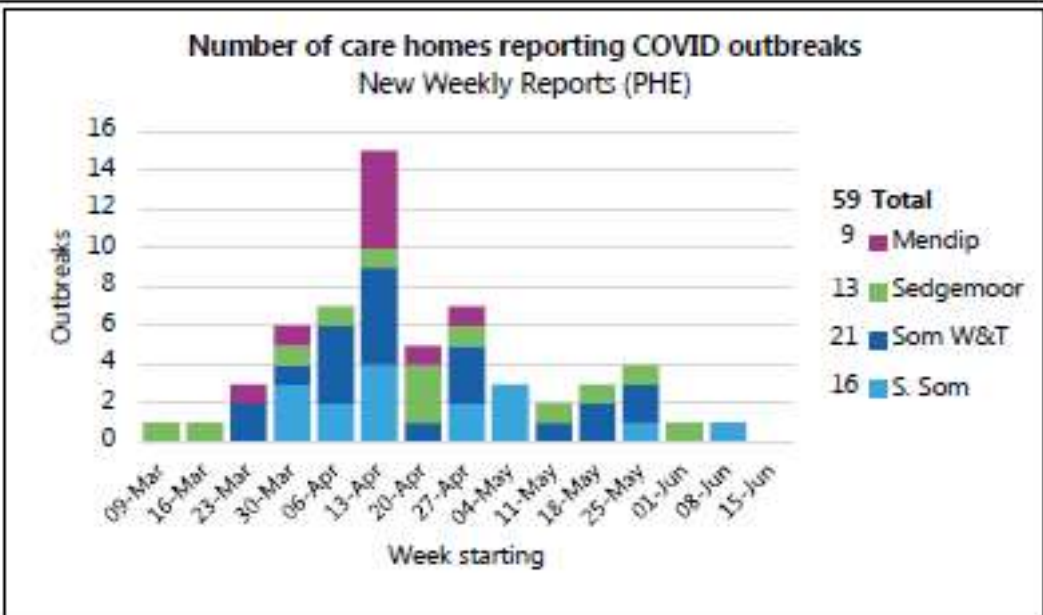
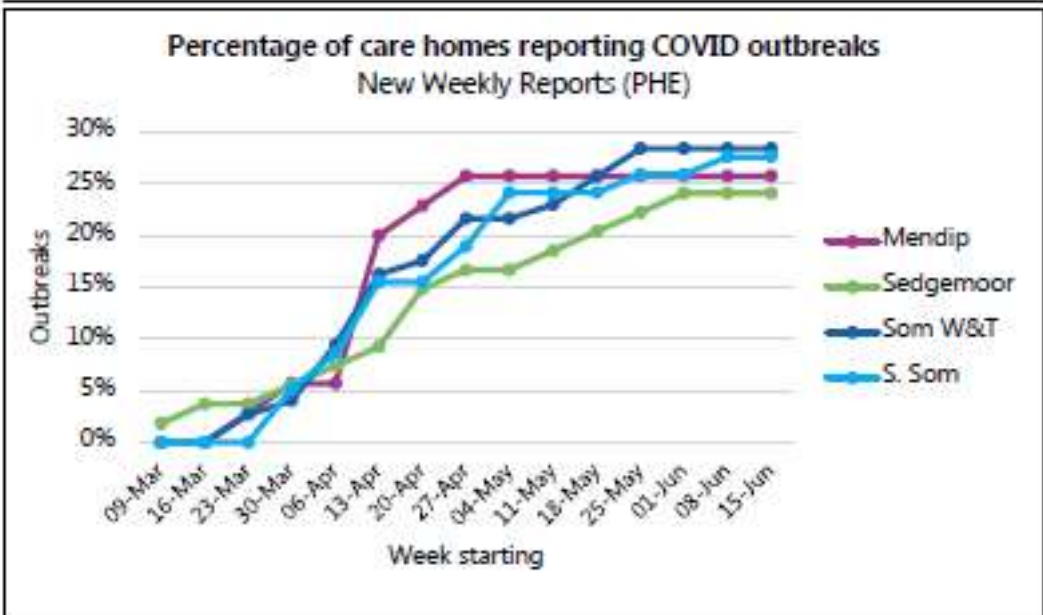

The reproduction number (R) is the average number of secondary infections produced by 1 infected person.

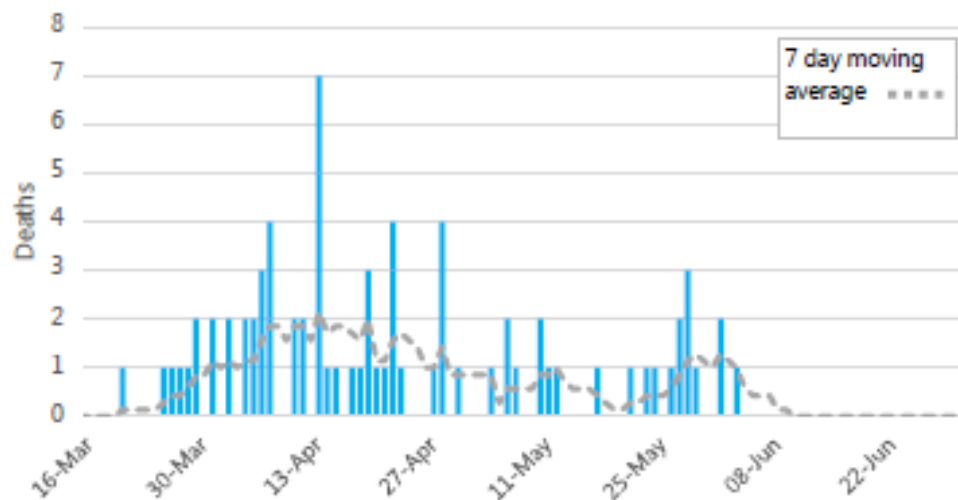

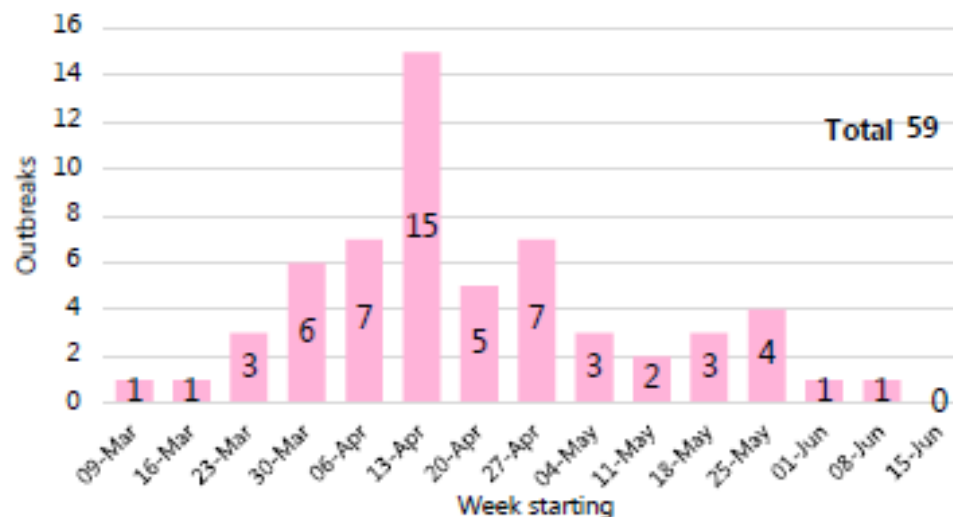

# Community & Resilience Cell

## Key Points *(figures correct as of 1<sup>st</sup> July)*

### **School holiday hunger:**

Government has agreed a Free School Meal (FSM) Voucher scheme for the summer holidays. Each child on FSM will receive Edenred vouchers worth £15 per week. The vouchers will be distributed by schools. In rural localities where there isn't a supermarket nearby that accepts the Edenred vouchers, arrangements have been put in place with local shops for a local "voucher" scheme. This has already worked well in Porlock and Watchet where it was found to be an effective way of supporting families during the lockdown.

### **Provide Holiday Activities and Childcare**

Childcare providers are being asked to register their offer on Somerset Choices

We are working with SASP, SPARK Somerset, Community Council for Somerset and Districts to identify holiday activity opportunities to fill a current gap in provision for the summer holiday for over 8 year olds.

### **Enable the system to move from emergency food response by:**

- Building on community infrastructures and established community partnerships
- Finding appropriate solutions in order to reduce risk of dependency on emergency food boxes and foodbanks and reduce risk of other issues eg. homelessness, health, care related
- Ensuring there is the ability to stand up additional capacity as required to meet increases in demand

6,669 calls have now been made to the **Somerset Coronavirus Support Helpline**. Calls at the weekend continue to trend low and staff capacity and out of hours are being tailored to match reduced demand. Volumes during the week are reducing too.

Mindline has expanded to cover children and young people. New resources, training and communications are being developed. Work is linked back to the Mental Health and Learning Disability Cell. Resources can be found

- The cell reviewed feedback gathered so far on the Somerset Commonplace website. 1<sup>st</sup> tranche schemes are having the right effect.
- We are still awaiting further clarification from the DFT regarding criteria for Tranche 2 funding.
- Arrangements have been put in place to check on Traffic Management following the opening of pubs this Saturday. Checks will be carried out on Sunday.

# Economic Response & Recovery

## Key points

- \*Business Intelligence** – Business intelligence group provides evidence to support response and recovery, gathered from district partners, business representative organisations, local and national surveys, national statistics and expert organisations and think tanks.
- The latest Somerset Bulletin on the Economic Impact of COVID-19 (Coronavirus) is available online** at: [www.somersetrends.org.uk/covid-19-bulletins](http://www.somersetrends.org.uk/covid-19-bulletins) - includes latest labour market data for the month of May, data on uptake of furloughing and self-employment support schemes, and new intelligence on the visitor economy.
- Feeding headline business issues through to BEIS weekly via Plymouth City Council/LEP.
- Oxford Economics preparing economic projections/scenarios on COVID impact and recovery for Somerset and the wider region.
- Somerset business survey is being prepared on the economic impacts of COVID and sentiments/plans regarding recovery – invitations will be sent to businesses.**
- \* Small Business Grant Fund - As of the 28 of June, 10,813 grants have now been awarded, with circa 84.1% of eligible claims processed and 85.2% of total funding now distributed.**
- The new discretionary grants scheme has been launched across the districts, with circa 1080 applications.**
- \* Local Solutions to Gaps In Local Support for Business**
- Working with partners to identify gaps in support and any vulnerabilities in local business support infrastructure – a phased programme of activity will be launched under the Business Rates Retention Scheme – a scheme for clusters/peer networks has just launched offering grants to establish/grow networks. Has been a good response so far with a mix of local and strategic applications; closing date is 31 July. A package of pre-start/start-up support has also been commissioned and will be rolled out as appropriate. Additional support will be phased over the coming months to supplement Growth Hub support and respond to local need.
- Somerset's Skill Up Service supplying general and bespoke advice to employers on managing their apprentices and other training needs as their businesses diversify to reflect need.
- \* Employment/Self Employment**
- Full Business Cases are being developed, under the Business Rates Retention scheme, to provide a holistic package of employment and skills support to both business and individuals.** This will include, but is not limited to, development of an online "hub", support to individuals impacted, mentoring for Not in Education, Employment or Training (NEETs), recruitment/skills fairs, establishment of employment hubs.
- It is anticipated that the online Hub will be developed and launched over the coming weeks followed by local employment hubs. Both will provide a one-stop-shop for businesses and individuals to find information in relation to employment and skills.
- Signed grant funding award for NEETs £1.3m ESF programme to support young people who are, or at risk of**

- Business Intelligence** – Prepare business survey for approval and distribution to business contacts by w/c 6th July. Review and disseminate findings from Oxford Economics modelling report.
- Business rates retention pilot** – Somerset Growth Board have endorsed funding for a package of support for the visitor economy and employment & skills. Full Business Cases are now being developed for approval.
- Economic recovery and growth plan** – draft plan to be prepared for early July 2020.
- Comms** – Action marketing plan, working on a campaign about public health messaging for reopening the visitor economy as part of the LOMP to reassure visitors and local residents.

# Somerset Multi-agency Recovery Coordination Group (MARCG)

The group will bring partners together to maximise **collaboration**, understand impact and deliver recovery activity whilst sustaining necessary response activity

### Big stories this week

- Work is under way by colleagues to understand and implementation of the **Local Outbreak Management Plan**, including how recovery and response must be structured to deliver the Plan, alongside recovery activity.
- **Local Resilience Forum sub-groups** on equalities, economic recovery and licensing are under way and the partnership is working well.
- **Government guidance on schools reopening** has been published (2/7/20).

### Key issues we are working together on

- The group is beginning a piece of work on “**proactive horizon scanning**” to anticipate changes in government guidance, set a position statement for recovery, and identify the opportunities and challenges in the medium and longer term. This work will support all aspects of recovery planning decision-making.
- Evidence of **stresses and strains that communities** are coming under was discussed: mental health, wellbeing and how we can work as a system to meet the challenge. The Group has agreed to keep sharing information and collaborating across existing cells and groups.
- **Directory of summer provision** for childcare and support will be published soon to help families

### Coming up / next steps

- **Economic recovery plan** for Somerset including a range of "asks" of government including on skills, infrastructure, housing, business support: draft anticipated in next few weeks.
- **NHS recovery plan** for phase 3 and beyond due 22 July.
- **Climate Emergency** is an essential component of recovery, and is represented on the Group. Strategy final draft end of July, for consultation and approval.



# Somerset Waste Partnership



- Recycling centres are now, to all intents and purposes, back to business as usual and accepting all materials (except for reuse – which we are still working on). Usage is roughly 75% of what we would expect at this time of year and queues and waiting times have been manageable. 'Shop style' social distancing is working well, and visitors are still limited to a maximum of two per car and should wear gloves when outside their vehicle.
- Whilst all kerbside services are running and many data/systems issues have still been addressed, the garden waste service is still underperforming. A recovery plan is in place to improve this and all kerbside services and SWP are closely monitoring Suez against this. This week over 9,000 garden waste service subscribers have been written to directly, providing them with a new collection day, or confirm the existing collection day. The success of this should ease pressures across collections and see improvements across the board, including in Customer Services.
- Next week
  - The garden waste service rerouting will start next Monday (6 July).
  - Further additional resources to assist in the clearing the backlog of customer enquiries.
  - Planning for the restart of Recycle More continues, acknowledging the challenges currently being faced and the need to have a stable, high-performing service before committing to such a large-scale service change.

# Health and Social Care

## (SCC contribution to H&SC Tactical Cells)

### Key points

- **Provider webinar planned** : Focus on advising care providers of changes related to the provision of Protective Personal Equipment. Webinar will also include grant returns linked to Infection Control Grant monies to demonstrate how funds are being used.
- **Distribution of 25% remaining Infection Control Grant:** across homecare providers, supported living and Extra Care Housing providers. A small amount will also be kept aside to support PAs, micro-providers and carers.
- **Guidance for Adult Social Care Staff:** Principal Social Worker drawing up clear guidance for frontline operational staff to support with the restoration of face – to –face visits and assessment/review activity, where individuals are keen for this to take place, on back of latest easing of COVID restrictions nationally
- **Demand starting to pick up again:** Locality Triage teams and Sourcing Care team reporting clear evidence that demand for services and homecare is starting to grow as restrictions ease across the county.

### Good News:

- **Congratulations to Vanessa Hodge (ASC Principal Social Worker)** who will, from 06/07/20, commence a part-time, 6 month secondment with the Dept of Health & Social Care following an invitation from the Chief Social Workers to support the implementation of their priorities, with a particular focus on social work and commissioning practice
- **Somerset Adult Social Care system referenced in positive terms within article in the Guardian / Observer** – outlines how Health and Social Care is working together in partnership to deliver improved outcomes for residents

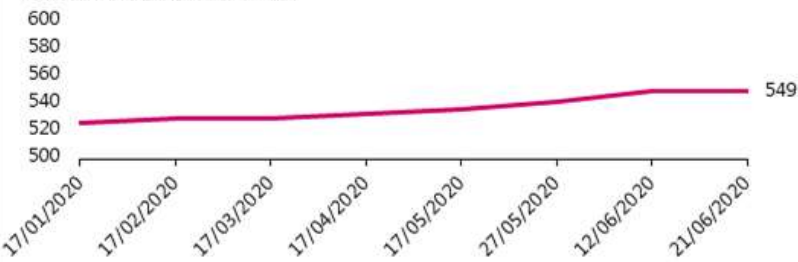
## Key Points

- Work continues with schools and social care to encourage attendance of vulnerable children, including with Independent Non Maintained schools
- Risk assessment process in place to support learners with EHC Plan to return to school
- Laptops for vulnerable learners currently being rolled out to schools
- Work progressing with partners to review options for supporting vulnerable families with activities and food over the summer holiday period
- Work progressing with partners to explore possible childcare options for school age children for the summer holiday
- Impact of Covid-19 on placement costs being monitored
- Impact of delays to Birth Registration process being monitored

## Successes

- Additional foster care enquiries & assessments generated through adapted processes
- LA link officers established for schools and EY settings to provide single points of contact
- Successful alternative solutions provided for supporting vulnerable families for respite (Outdoor Education Centres)
- Monitoring and reporting of attendance across all schools
- Embedding of Multi-Agency Linked Professional safeguarding approach
- Delivery of an average of 1,000 Free School Meal boxes / week to schools
- Establishment of multi-agency universal and targeted support offer for vulnerable teenagers over the summer holiday
- Summer holiday Free School Meal vouchers – issues for rurally isolated families resolved – vouchers for local shops to be made available, or Village Agents to support

# Schools – Extending Provision

## Key Points

- All schools with primary aged children and all secondary schools are offering extended provision. Data shows gradual increase in key groups since 01 June
- Government Covid catch-up plan announced for next academic year, comprising grant (for all schools) and national tutoring programme (for disadvantaged pupils)
- Vulnerable children, key worker children, and those with an EHCP will continue to be prioritised for allocation of school places
- School capacity affected by numbers of key worker children and available teaching space
- Schools working towards blended virtual and face to face curriculum offer alongside increased school attendance
- Support available to help schools manage anxiety for learners, parents and staff in relation to phased return to school
- Public Health providing regular updates on data and guidance
- Schools preparing for possible 'Requests for Information' around assessed exam results
- School transport – planning for September including matching bubbles/social distancing/staggered opening times.

## Successes

- All Somerset schools are now offering extended provision, numbers continuing to rise
- Early years attendance numbers continue to rise
- School leadership appreciative of SCC support during Covid 19 period and on implementing extended provision
- Outdoor curriculum offer developed with partners / agencies with 250 staff trained
- Emergency PPE provided and on-going ordering process established

## Actions Going Forward

- Reviewing options for holiday childcare provision with partners
